

A NEW LIFE FOR THE OLD FIRE STATION

For several decades 115 High St. served as the home of Thornapple Township Emergency Services. Some lifelong residents of the area may remember touring the fire station as a child and seeing all of the cartoon characters painted on the walls. Others may remember the station because they or one of their family members served on the department. Over the years, many cherished memories were made at this building.

In 2002 Thornapple Township elected to build a new fire station to replace this building that was becoming outdated. After the new station was built, the old station was sold to the Village in 2005. Since 2005, the property largely sat empty and was only used for storage. For years, a number of different thoughts and ideas about the building's future have been discussed. Finally, earlier this year Village Council voted to send out a request for a proposal for the purchase and development of this property.

The Village received two propsal for development. The proposal that Council voted to move forward with was from Acorn Treehouse Ventures in partnership with Left Field Coffee Shop. The proposed development will remodel the 6,075-square-foot building and will feature an updated façade consisting of new large windows, glass garage doors, metal awnings, and a fresh exterior. The main lower level of the interior of the building will consist of a space for coffee roasting. canning, and a kitchen area on one side. The other side will feature a year-round, indoor/outdoor patio space where customers can sit and chat and community gatherings can be held. The second floor will be remolded into a modern two-bedroom apartment.

Once the sale is finalized, the Village will be allowed to use the building for one year, allowing the Village time to construct new storage for the Department of Public Works. Renovation to the second floor will begin soon after the sale is final and all renovations are expected to be complete by 2025. Once complete, this project will extend the downtown business area and will bring new life to a building that has been a part of this community for decades.

Election Information

On March 8, 2022 the Township of Thornapple Election Commission directed the Township Clerk to rearrange the precinct boundaries of 2 and 3, resulting in all three precincts being under the required precinct size not to exceed 2,999 registered voters. The description of precincts 2 and 3 are as follows:



PRECINCT #2: All Thornapple Township residents East of M-37 and Village of Middleville residents East of Grand Rapids Street and North of E Main Street.

The polling location for Precinct #2 is at the Thornapple Township Hall, 200 E. Main Street, Middleville, MI 49333.



PRECINCT #3: All Village of Middleville residents West of Grand Rapids Street and South of E Main Street. The polling location for Precinct #3 is at the Village Hall, 100 E. Main Street, Middleville, MI 49333.

Friendly Reminders

YARD WASTE COLLECTION

Last day for biodegradable paper yard waste bag pick up will be October 10, 2022, weather permitting. After October 10, leaves should be raked to the curbside for vacuuming until the last day, November 11, 2022. Please ensure that the yard waste doesn't cover the sidewalk, interfere with pedestrian traffic, or protrude into any part of the paved roadway. Thank you!

BRUSH COLLECTION

Last brush pick-up will be October 10, 2022, weather permitting.

HAZARDOUS WASTE AND BUILDING MATERIAL DISPOSAL

Last hazardous waste collection at the Expo Center, Barry County Fairgrounds, 1350 N. M-37 Hwy, Hastings, MI 49058, will be on Saturday, September 17, 2022 between 9 am and 1 pm, sponsored by the Barry County Solid Waste Oversight Committee. TRASH & WASTE HAULER

The Village of Middleville has contracted with Republic Services for residential trash pick-up and curbside recycling. Republic Services is the only residential trash and recycling service available in Middleville.

RECREATIONAL VEHICLE STORAGE

WINTER REMINDERS

Shake your mailbox! Over time mailboxes deteriorate, the post is damaged, and the wood, if they are mounted on a wood post, begins to rot and decay. When the snow plows came through, they threw snow with a significant amount of force. A well-maintained mailbox can withstand that force. Make sure your mailbox is securely attached to avoid any damage. Thank you!

Winter is coming! Please be aware that the Village Code of Ordinance on Sec. 66-123 (a) and (c) stipulates: "(a) No vehicle shall be parked on any street in the Village between the hours of 2 am and 6 am from November 1 through March 31, and (c) no vehicle shall be parked in any village-owned or operated parking lot between the hours of 3 am and 6 am."

Remember that recycling and garbage containers should be placed behind the curb line or off the roads. By doing so, you are helping our Department of Public Works crew properly clear the snow off the streets.

Our Mission: A Thriving Community

Over twenty years ago, the Village Council voted to create a DDA, or Downtown Development Authority. According to the State of Michigan, a DDA is a special governmental entity that a local government can create to "halt property value deterioration and increase property valuation in its business district...and promote economic growth." The DDA is funded by a small part of the tax revenue from properties within the downtown district as well donations from Community Partners. All of the funding for the DDA is then reinvested back into downtown through public improvements that help grow property values and boost the local economy. In Middleville, the DDA takes a three pronged approach and focuses on historic preservation and revitalization, economic growth and development, and community engagement.

Historic Preservation: Projects like the Train Depot Restoration, or working with property owners to renovate, rather than demolish, existing buildings (like the Lofts) are great examples of the historic preservation work that the DDA performs.

Economic Development: Through infrastructure projects that create the "small-town" charm Middleville is known for, grants and services that support our small businesses, and programs like the Middleville Market that support local growers and makers, the DDA works to cultivate a thriving business community

Community Engagement: The DDA works to build a sense of place and a sense of belonging for all members of our community with vibrant community events that bring people together, preserve our heritage, help neighbors to forge strong friendships with one another, and bring new patrons to our downtown businesses.

Each of these three focus points are distinct and unique, but they share a united goal: As we work to reinvest in this amazing community, we build a bright future rooted in the rich heritage of the past.

The Middleville DDA has nine voting board members, one at-large member, a director, and a treasurer. The DDA meets in the Council Chambers at Village Hall on the third Tuesday of each month at 6 pm., and the public is always welcome.

The DDA Office is open 9am-5pm, Tuesday through Friday, and is located inside the Mix Coworking Studio at 125 E. Main St. Our staff works closely with local businesses and civic groups, so please call ahead to ensure staff is in the office before dropping by. YEAR TO DATE UPDATE: NEW PROJECTS AND BUSINESSES

COMMUNITY **PROJECTS**

The Village Councill and staff are working hard on several projects this year, including capital improvements to the water treatment and asset management systems. The new dog park is complete and open for public enjoyment. The DDA is working on adding art and improved seating to the Amphitheater area. The DDA is also working with Vintage Building Restoration of Hasintgs to refurbish our Train Depot, which is now on the National Register of Historic Places. A committee is also planning to start a community library that is independent of the school library.

WASTE WATER TREATMENT EXPANSION

Over the last ten months, the Village of Middleville staff and contractors have been working on an expansion of the Village's Waste Water Treatment Plant. The plant is currently able to treat 500,000 gallons per day. The plant is treating roughly 450,000 gallons per day. When the expansion is complete, capacity will be large enough to serve our growing community for decades to come. The project consists of adding two additional sewer treatment tanks, double the slug storage tank, and a number of mechanical and electrical updates. The expansion project is about two- thirds complete. Mid-October is the scheduled completion date for this project.

In mid-August, the process of installing a cured-in-place pipe in The Downs area will begin. This portion of the project is planned to take about two weeks. During this time, residents will have periods when they cannot use the sewer services. Residents should not lose sewer services for more than 6 or 7 hours after the lining is completed. After Labor Day, contractors will be in to start the reconstruction of Greenwood St and Whippoorwill Ct. Residents in the construction area will receive at least one week's notice before work on Greenwood and Whippoorwill begins.
